One Pager

This reaction exercise includes the following:

1. A drawing or sketch that represents the reading for you. Using or importing clip art or pictures from the Internet is fine (cite correctly).

(How can you symbolize the text? Don't worry if you are not an artist. That does not matter.)

- 2. Two passages that you found personally meaningful. (Two excerpts you found revealing or enlightening. Choose passages that you think are important to the story.)
- 3. One interpretive statement: What did the reading mean to you?

(What did you learn from the reading? Think about the novel's theme[s]. Don't tell me you didn't learn anything!)

4. One statement or comment about the reading—your personal response.

(Be prepared to explain your comment.)

Each of these things should be done on the front of the page. Hence the *one pager*.
